Global Urea prices look set to continue firming if as expected China remain absent from the export market. This coincides with two significant events firstly another Indian tender for urea is expected very shortly, in which many in the industry expect a large volume to be committed. Secondly, Brazil have been reported as back in the market as significant demand appears. The next few weeks will set the scene for urea trade for the next 2 to 3 months.
